OBJECTIVES:

Currently the red dot system has fast become the optics of choice for individuals purchasing or updating their pistols. Understanding the differences between shooting with standard iron sights and the red dot system is key. This course will focus on the proper draw, grip and presentation of the weapon to quickly get the dot onto the target. All red dot systems that come with a new purchase have what is called a "factory zero". Few shooters realize the red dot must be zeroed to them. This is even more important and true with the purchase and add on to a previously purchased weapon system.
